### **Employee and Family Assistance Program**

### **Working Bridges**

Working Bridges, an initiative of the United Way of Northwest Vermont, provides a Resource Coordinator who works with employees seeking connection to community resources to address life issues that may affect work. #### **LeRoyer Employee Emergency Financial Support**

This program provides assistance for financial emergencies caused by unexpected events (ex. Unplanned housing needs, shutoff of major utilities, sudden illness of self or family member, unexpected death of family member). Eligible employees must be actively employed with a minimum of three months of service (regular permanent status). Assistance is given in the form of a loan. Applications are available on the UVMMC Intranet or by contacting EFAP at (802) 847-2827 or EFAP@uvmhealth.org.

### **EastRise Credit Union Pay Advance Loan Program**

This programs provides employees with access to loans of up to \$750 for first request and \$1000 for subsequent requests (pro-rated for part-time employees). Eligible employees must be actively employed in good standing with a minimum of one year (12 months) of service. This loan is treated like a conventional bank loan with interest applied. This program is handled exclusively through EastRise Credit Union. Applications are available on the UVMMC Intranet or by contacting EFAP at (802) 847-2827 or EFAP@uvmhealth.org.

### For Home Health and Hospice Employees

- WARMTH The WARMTH Support Program uses funds donated by concerned Vermonters to help low-income families pay their energy costs. WARMTH funds are available when a household has exhausted its supply of fuel or faces disconnection of utility services. Funds are only available when an individual has not been able to find sufficient help through other channels.

#### **Payday Advance Loan**

Through an agreement with North Country Federal Credit Union, the UVM Health Network Home Health & Hospice provides employees with access to a loan of up to \$1,000.00 (pro-rated for part-time employees) to help employees with emergency/unplanned needs. The loan is repaid through bi-weekly payroll deductions. Employees will be charged interest for the loan at 16.99%, and there is a \$5 account set-up fee that may be taken from the loan amount if an account with NCFCU is not already established. ### **Mission Possible Employee Crisis Fund**

The Mission Possible Employee Crisis Fund can provide confidential financial assistance to employees having an unforeseen crisis and no other resources. Funds are distributed directly to creditors as a one-time gift (up to \$500) with no repayment obligation. Decisions are made by Porter's Mission Possible Employee Committee. #### **Income Advance Loan**

### The Janice McLean Fund

The Janice McLean Employee Assistance Fund is designed to assist CVPH employees with more than 6 months of service, who have a financial emergency and have no other resource to turn to for assistance. The Fund is meant to fill a need which cannot be met through any other agency. Employees are eligible to receive up to \$750 for family emergencies in the form of an interest-free loan from the Janice McLean Fund. In very extreme cases, the committee may decide to award a one-time grant. Application can be accessed on the CVPH intranet. Completed applications should be submitted to CVPH Human Resources.
